Restraint

Man must have restraint. The idea of absolute freedom without restraint will destroy human civilization. Man whose heart is darkened by sin is unable to govern himself without being restrained against wrong doing.

The best kind of restraint is self-restraint. This arises from within the person and causes him to behave himself because it is the right thing to do. Yet, the motivation for self-restraint comes from without. It comes from a belief in an object right and wrong, which, in turn, is delivered to man from a Higher Being. For example, the Scripture says that "the love of Christ constraineth us." 2 Corinthians 5:14. When we realize how much God (or Christ) love us, we are constrained to respond to Him in obedience and return His love. At the same time, we are restrained from committing evil because we know He doesn't want us to.

When people throw off all self-restraint, restraint must be imposed upon them by an outward force – if their civilization is to survive. That is the purpose of civil law. It is ordained of God for the punishment of evildoers and the praise of well-doers. 1 Peter 2:14. One of the purposes of the punishment of crime is to restrain evil-doing. The purpose of praise of well-doing is to reinforce and encourage good behavior. Christians, of all people, should be supportive of the civil authority. Romans 13:1-4.

Christians are expected by their Lord to exercise restraint. Their inward man is in control of their lives and the inward man is, in turn, controlled by the principles of the Word of God. A part of the fruit of the Spirit is self-control. Galatians 5:23 NKJV. Self control is one of the Christian graces. 2 Peter 1:6 NKJV. The Christian should not have to have anyone force him to behave himself. He should do the right and shun the wrong because this is what he wants to do.

However, self-restraint is a taught thing. Little children need to be taught how to control their impulses, desires, reactions, tempers and words very early in life. When accountable persons are taught the gospel, they are taught to gain control of their lives and submit them to the Lord's way.

They learn that the Word of God, the Bible, is the standard for determining what is wrong (that which they should restrain themselves from), and right (that which they should do). Then a realization of Christ's love for them gives them motivation to comply.

The only true freedom we have in this life is in Christ Jesus, as everyone who is outside of Christ is in slavery to sin. But freedom is not license to throw off all restraint. True freedom of any sort involves restraint, and for those in Christ, this is especially true.
