Bethel Campaign 2009 Summary

Around a year ago we had an idea doing an evangelistic door knocking campaign for our congregation with the main thrust to encourage home Bible studies. I had participated in a few mission trips in the states where the participants did just that. The thought occurred the we should try such an exercise. After talking it up with friends in February, I told Kyle that I was going to bring it up in a business meeting and see what the response would be. I was happy and thrilled when the men okayed such a task and were very supportive. After much e-mailing, planning, praying and pushing through discouraging words (some saying it would not have results) it became a reality.

Thanks be to God in heaven for such good weather and for the helpers that came our way. In February I talked with several interested individuals and as the time was approaching, many did not have a chance to come.

Michael and Diane Richardson, Erik and Adrienne Pfaff and Wilbern and Brenda Horner came to help us with the campaign and VBS. Lest we forget, the Market Street congregation helped us with door knocking for VBS and provided transportation for VBS. I am especially proud that we had such a good turn out from our congregation, helping with the VBS and campaign.

Here are the results for the door knocking campaign. The numbers reflect the efforts on September 18, 21, 22, 23. The area/ roads covered are Sparta Pike (from I40 to the railroad tracks in Watertown), Greenwood Road, Young Road, Lindsley Road, Cainsville Road (from Lindsley Road to I40), Walnut Road, Mill Road, Locust Grove Road, Eastover Road, Turner Road, Linwood Road (an over lapping piece between roads) and Bailey Road.

We averaged 120 doors knocked per day, three teams @ three and one-half days. Our goal was set at 10 Bible studies (counting set up, correspondence and possibles) and we exceeded that goal with 17 total! How we have been truly blessed. Now the real work begins.

Thanks to all that helped. No matter how small you feel your part is necessary and beneficial to the campaign and the kingdom of God. It takes all to make this work from the building cleaners to the food preparers and all in between.

To God be the glory for all the great things that were done and will continue to be done. Continue to pray for the work and for the contacts, that they may be receptive to the work of the Spirit, God's word will be allowed to move one to obedience to the gospel.
