### **Power of The Word**

Preaching has diminished through the years into basic entertainment. Modern preachers have given themselves over to the notion that people no longer want to hear an exposition of some passage from God's word. Preachers have decided that people want to be thrilled, or emotionally uplifted, or inspired by stories of human interest. Thus to keep their "jobs" as preachers, they give the people what they want.

Paul predicted this in a statement to Timothy:

"For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but wanting to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own desires; and will turn away their ears from the truth, and will turn aside to myths." (2 Tim. 4:3,4)

Much modern preaching has become only words of men and could not be categorized as the "word of God." When the apostle Paul wrote his first letter back to the infant congregation in Thessalonica, he said; "And for this reason we also constantly thank God that when you received from us the word of God's message, you accepted it not as the word of men, but for what it really is, the word of God, which also performs its work in you who believe" (1 Thess. 2:13).

Only the word of God can perform the work of God in the minds and hearts of believers. The words of men have no power to bring folks into the righteousness of God. Only God, by means of His word can change a man into what God wants him to be.

I like the reminder given to those of us who preach..."Preach the Word!" That's where the power is, and unless we plug into that power, we will never be energized to change. Perhaps we also need to remind those who sit in the pews..."Listen to the Word!"
