A Different Perspective

This past week I went to an auction, one of those good 'ol fashioned *junque* sales. There was something for everyone. I have always found auction both fun and fascinating. For me there has always been a thrill of the rhythmic chant of the auctioneer, the anticipation, not to mention the racing of your heart when you are in the thick of things competing with someone else bidding.
