Why Does God Allow Suffering?

You will not here find the definitive answer to the question. You will, however, be challenged to seriously consider this question. It is as relevant today as it has been from the beginning of human existence. Undoubtedly you recall the pronouncement of God to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden in response to their sin. As recorded in Genesis 3:16-19, they were sentenced to a totally different life than they had experienced prior to sin. Pain, sorrow, and suffering were to become a part of their existence – that which they had not before experienced. So, sin is a source of suffering.

Are there other sources or reasons for chronic illness and suffering? Absolutely. When Jesus was asked by his apostles as to who had sinned to bring about the blindness of the man begging at the temple in John 9, Jesus answered that it was not the result of sin. He said that the situation occasioned an opportunity for God's glory to be demonstrated. Jesus then gave sight to a man who had never seen light.

Perhaps you recall various examples in the Bible for suffering and the reasons given. Most recorded examples relate to sin and a prompt by God for repentance. Such was true with Nebuchadnezzar. God caused him to become insane and behave like an animal for his idolatry and pride. See Daniel 4.

I conclude that sin remains today a true source of suffering. Such is true when an alcoholic kills an innocent individual while driving drunk. On the other hand, a young child of godly parents may be stricken with a deadly disease. Despite prayer on their part and countless others, God may choose to allow that child to die from the disease. In this life, we may never know exactly why. Is this an occasion to cause these parents lean ever more upon God, one another, and God's family? Is it an occasion to draw unbelievers to God through the faith which these two demonstrate? Is it an occasion to prompt believers to remember how temporary this life is and how blessed we are to be recipients of a promise of life to come without sickness, pain, suffering, or sorrow?

In each event of suffering, let us resolve to address any potential issues of sin and then allow for God's glory to be demonstrated with how we respond to the circumstance before us.

Genesis 3:16-19 To the woman he said, "I will surely multiply your pain in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children. Your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you." And to Adam he said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your wife and have eaten of the tree of which I commanded you, 'You shall not eat of it,' cursed is the ground because of you; in pain you shall eat of it all the days of your life: thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

John 9:3 Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him."
