Mistakenly Crediting God

It seems that our culture is filled with mistaken credits to God. By that, I mean that God gets the blame in every ill circumstance of natural disaster. Yes, such events are typically referred to as "acts of God." No doubt, even your insurance policy uses this terminology to describe the same. Then, in many situations where a tragic accident occurs and someone suffers serious injury or death, people will be asking silently or aloud, "Why did God allow this to happen?" And when an evil person commits a terrible act of violence toward one or more other people, various ones question why God allowed that evil to occur. And finally, there is a common saying even among some Christians: "I was providentially hindered." I contend that in each of these circumstances, people mistakenly credit God. People are making claim that an event or circumstance is the result of the workings of God.

No doubt, you'll remember that Satan never received credit in the life of Job when calamity struck him -- even though Satan was indeed the source of the ill circumstances. And when people violate the natural laws God put into place to govern this physical existence, there will be natural consequences. If one jumps from a tall building and lands on the sidewalk below without his fall being slowed or his body being protected, death will ensue. The man died as a result of his own actions accidental or deliberate. God did not cause the outcome. When a father falls asleep while driving and runs off the road into a bridge overpass, he and his family may all die. Again, God did not do this. As for natural disasters, they are also a part of the natural laws God created to govern this physical world. Yet, God does not engage in causing hurricanes, tornadoes, volcanic eruptions, earth quakes, etc. Those who exercise God-given free will to commit sinful acts which harm others are not being routinely thwarted by God. God did not create us with free will and then promise that He will intervene every time we exercise it to bring about harm to others. God did not promise us that He will intervene every time we violate natural laws that will otherwise result in serious injury or death. And finally, when we have occurrences in our lives which prevent us from being able to engage in some good action such as attending worship service, it is not that God caused it. Thus, the Christian must not be

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saying that he was providentially hindered. Perhaps someone long ago came up with this expression from the life of Paul. Paul certainly was providentially hindered from his ongoing efforts to persecute Christians. He was stopped in his tracks by the bright light and thundering voice on his travel to Damascus. See **Acts 9**. And perhaps, providence is not the right description even of this intervention. Providence is better used to describe how God causes things to work out for the good eventually in the lives of His children. **Romans 8:28** "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose."

To summarize, it must be with caution that we attribute credit or blame to God for ill circumstances. As Christians we are bombarded with false attributions such as those mentioned above. Thus so many fail to recognize how benevolent God really is. Because of these cultural issues, it is an extra challenge for us to enable people to see the good and loving nature of God when calamity ensues.
