What is a Miracle?

Miracles today are looked at as if they are simply some great phenomenon, something wonderful and great. How often have you heard someone say, "It's a miracle he made it through that accident." Or, "It's a miracle he made it through some operation." Or perhaps when referring to the birth of a child, someone might say, "What a great miracle." When many people think of a miracle today, the above remarks are what they are referring to; they really do not understand what constitutes a true miracle.

A true miracle is much different than what many folks believe miracles are today. W.E. Vine says a miracle is, "power, inherent ability; is used of works of a supernatural origin and character, such as could not be produced by natural agents and means" (Vine's Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words).

In the Bible we find miracles are referred to as "wonders," "signs" and "powers" (cf. Acts 2:22; Hebrews 2:4; 2 Thessalonians 2:9). Also the word "works" is used in some cases to show a miracle was performed (John 5:20; 6:28-29; 9:3-4; 10:37-38). All these terms describe for us different areas that were used to indicate a miracle was performed.

In the Bible when a miracle was performed, it was done in such a manner that all who witnessed it could testify that it truly was from God.

The miracles Jesus performed were so notable no one could prove the things He did were not from God. When He healed the sick, it was witnessed by all in such a fashion that none could deny that what He had done was from God. For example: The raising of Lazarus from the dead in **John 11:43-45**. Notice the text: "Jesus said, Take ye away the stone. Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he hath been dead four days" (John 11:39). Lazarus had been in the ground for four days; his body had already begun to decompose. But at the command of the Lord, Lazarus comes forth from the grave. "And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud

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voice, Lazarus, come forth. And he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go. Then many of the Jews which came to Mary, and had seen the things which Jesus did, believed on him" (John 11:43-45). Because of this miracle, many of the Jews believed on Him.

Those who saw the miracles of the New Testament recognized that the things taking place went beyond the ordinary. When Peter healed the lame man of Acts 3, he and John had to go before the Sanhedrin to answer as to what they had done. As this deed was examined, the Sanhedrin could not say anything against them, "And beholding the man which was healed standing with them, they could say nothing against it" (Acts 4:14). Even they realized that what was done was that of a supernatural origin. "Saying, what shall we do to these men? For that indeed a notable miracle hath been done by them is manifest to all them that dwell in Jerusalem; and we cannot deny it" (Acts 4:16).

Miracles in the New Testament were always done in such a way that all who say could say this was from God.

It is interesting to note that of all the so-called miracle workers of today, none of them have ever (nor can they ever in the future) perform a miracle that shows the super-natural. When put to the test, all the so-called miracle workers of today fail totally and completely to be able to reproduce a miracle like unto that of the Bible.

When You Walk Through the Storms

There is an old hymn that says, "when you walk through the storm, keep your head up high; an don't be afraid of the dark." It concludes with the words, "Walk on, walk on, walk on through the rain and you'll never walk alone." Other songs speak of storms. For example, you may remember the line, "When storms around are sweeping, when lone my watch I'm keeping,...Remember me, O Mighty One!" Another example is "when upon life's billows you are tempest tossed, when you are discouraged, thinking all is lost..."

Life does have its storms and we can face the storms with doubt or faith. Doubt motivates us to ask, Why is this happening to me?" Or, "Does God care that this is happening to me?" Or, "How can a good God allow this to happen?" On the other hand, faith knows that storms come because we live in a fallen world and believers are not exempt from suffering. Additionally, faith doesn't understand everything but it does trust God to see us through whatever happens to us. Faith remembers that God has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you" (Heb. 13:5), and "casting all your care upon Him, for he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7). and "In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us" (Romans 8:37).

Doubt sees the storms, trembles, and collapses. Faith sees the storms, is "knocked down, but is never knocked out" (2 Cor. 4:9) and experiences the presence of the Lord. Doubt will ultimately come (see Romans 8:28). Storms will come. They will take many forms. They, at times will be devastating, But, "when you walk through the storm, the dark...never walk along." We have His word on that.
