Paul wrote in **1 Thessalonians 4:9-10**, "But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another And indeed ye do it toward all the brethren which are in Macedonia: but we beseech you, brethren, that ye increase more and more;"

It seems Paul is saying here that brotherly love ought to come naturally to the child of God. As His children we have become partakers in His nature. We know that God is love, and as His children we also are to love each other. Brethren, the command here is not to "accept" one another or to "put up with" one another. It is not even to "know" one another or to "like" on another. The command, and yes it is a command, is to "love" one another. Love is often misunderstood. Many people think that love is an emotion. A number of songs that have been written about love speak of it as an emotion. Love is not an emotion. An emotion is an involuntary feeling in response to a person or event. Love is an intellectual exercise. Love must be cultivated. The way you learn to love someone is not by changing that person to meet your standards but by learning to practice love in spite of yourself. It has been said that love conquers all, but one must first conquer the envy, prejudice, resentment, or pride in himself before he can truly learn to love.

So it is with brotherly love. We are to love each other as God loves us. It is easy to love God, right? Well, it may not be as easy as many think. God has stated that if we do not love our brother, we do not love Him (1 John 4:20-21). You see, we love God because He first loved us (1 John 4:19). That's easy enough. It is not hard at all to love someone who loves you. But look at how God loves us:

"But God commandeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom 5:8)

God did not wait for us to meet his expectations before He loved us. He loved us when we were dirty, vile, wretched sinners. He loved us when He couldn't abide with us because of our sin. He loved us even when we rejected Him. He loved us so much that He sacrificed His Son on a cross

for us so He might once more abide with us.

Jesus said, "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another." (John 14:34) So you see, we are to love each other as Christ has loved us. We were practicing love, but they needed to increase more and more. Their love for all brethren must pass the boundaries of Macedonia. The love that they had for each other was not enough, for it could not have been the love with which Christ had loved them. That is perfect love. Let us so love. There is no room in God's kingdom for jealousies, grudges, or any lack of love between brethren. Perfect love casts out fear (1 John 4:18).

The Emotional Effects of Sin

Mental illness is undoubtedly one of the major health problems of our society. It has been estimated that at least half of those persons in hospital beds are there partly because of their emotional problems. Dr. S.I. McMillen, author of "None of These Diseases," has made the statement that "medical science recognizes that emotions such as fear, sorrow, envy. resentment and hatred are responsible for the majority of our sickness. Estimates vary from sixty percent to nearly one hundred percent." What are some of the emotional effects of sin?

First, sin separates a person from a being of absolute purity, God (Isaiah 59:1-2). No one can live a fulfilling life and enjoy true happiness as long as he is separated from his creator.

Second, sin saddens. The prodigal son was in a state of depression until he "came to himself" and was reunited with his father (**Luke 15:1**).

Third, sin scars. Even when a person knows he has been forgiven of his in, he may continue to carry the burden of his sin. Long after his conversion, Paul still referred to himself as he "chief of sinners" (1 Tim 1:15).

Fourth, sin sours. Carrying the burden of sin can often cause a person to become negative and overly critical of others.

Fifth, sin sickens. Sin, along with its consequences and feelings of guilt, can produce heart problems, ulcers, and emotional difficulties.

Sixth, sin scars. When sin is left uncorrected it allows the heart to become hardened. Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus concerning those persons who were "past feeling" (**Eph. 4:19**).
